THE HORN OF THE UNICORN!

Eighty percent of what religious people believe is FANTASY!

How do we know for sure what we believe is fact not fiction? The question is, <u>do you know?</u>

Three questions may help you solve this dilemma!

- 1. How confident are you?
- 2. How would you FEEL if you were WRONG?
- 3. What would change your mind?

WHAT WE BELIEVE WE OWN THAT IS IMPORTANT TO GOD!

Our belief system impacts our actions and decisions, yet we never stop to question why we believe. More often than not, we believe what others around us think or what we believe. (Our brains are usually lazy and gullible). The unicorn is a magical creature, and those who live in a fantasy world are deceived and void of God's understanding. God's understanding leads to Wisdom. Allow God's horn of Salvation to point you to the living water of Jesus Christ.

The horn in the Bible is a symbol of power. Psalm 18:2: "The LORD is my rock and my fortress and my deliverer, my God, my rock, in whom I take refuge, my shield, and the horn of my salvation, my stronghold" Luke 1:69: Zechariah praises God for "raising up a horn of salvation for us in the house of his servant David" Mith has it that the unicorn horn is associated with purity, healing power, and the ability to purify water. Supposedly, it symbolizes protection against poison and represents a source of divine power and grace. That, my friend, is almost a perfect illusion, attempting to duplicate a replacement for God's truth, much like (AI) Artificial intelligence is!

This leaves a dilemma: Which horn have you grabbed hold of?

The spiral horn of the unicorn or the Horn of the Lord? Fairy tale believers believe that the spirals on the unicorn point to the cycles of time. For ancient biblical writers, the "horn" symbolized an animal's power and strength, just as the words "bow" or "sword" often referred to the strength of individuals and <u>nations</u>. Our Father's Timeline doesn't spiral; it is straight as an arrow and directs <u>us through all three Heaven and Earth Ages</u>.

Christians should never allow fantasy to define who we are! We are to be <u>Warriors</u> for Christ!

Each of us must find our strengths in Jesus Christ. While developing our weaknesses is good, we should focus primarily on building and managing our strengths! God has made us who we are. However, it is through understanding God's knowledge that directs us through life. **Understanding** is the polishing rouge **God uses to remove blemishes from our hearts.** These blemishes can keep us from finding our **destiny** and why God put us here in the first place. Each of us must be able to hear His truth. Only God the Father can give us eyes to see and ears to listen to <u>His Spiritual TRUTH</u>!

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Proverbs 8: 1-9, :1-Does not wisdom cry out,

And understanding lift up her voice? : 2-She takes her stand on the top of the high hill, Beside the way, where the paths meet. : 3-She cries out by the gates, at the entry of the city, At the entrance of the doors: 4-"To you, O men, I call, And my voice is to the sons of men. : 5-O you simple ones, understand prudence, And you fools, be of an understanding heart. : 6-Listen, for I will speak of excellent things, And from the opening of my lips will come right things; : 7-For my mouth will speak truth; Wickedness is an abomination to my lips. : 8-All the words of my mouth are with righteousness; Nothing crooked or perverse is in them. : 9-They are all plain to him who understands, And right to those who find knowledge.

Our personal experiences can easily mislead us!

That doesn't stop us from being confident, though. After all, we have "facts "(don't we) and "evidence" on our side! And it sure "feels" like we know our belief system is accurate. Those who disagree with us are letting their emotions get in the way of being logical. Seeing agreeing comments on social media platforms only deepens the gap between a worldly view and God's reality!

Once a belief is formed, we use conscious bias to search for flavored-supporting information to reinforce it. Maybe we've heard a vivid emotional story. It's possible we even have a personal experience of our own. After all, the best way of knowing something is to have seen or experienced it firsthand, right?!?! The only way to understand the difference between the Truth and a Lie is to know the one telling the story personally! Christianity is precisely that... and knowing the storyteller is the Key.

Do you know the difference between a Sea Story and a fairy tale?

A fairytale starts "ONCE UPON A TIME," a Sea Story starts… "THIS AIN'T NO BULL"! How do Christians go about telling stories without spreading BULL or fairy tails? We do this by digging out the facts! Sometimes, we think we follow the evidence to a conclusion. In reality, we come to our beliefs in irrational ways and then work backward to find evidence to rationalize them.

What criteria do you use to proclaim your faith?

I used four criteria to form my belief system! Evidence, of course! The trick, though, isn't to search for evidence that supports our belief system **<u>but to evaluate</u> <u>the evidence that would prove it false</u>**. If you can't think of a way to disprove your faith, it's untestable, and "evidence" is meaningless. It might be accurate, but how can you display the evidence to others searching for answers? Also, how will **you know for sure what you believe is true**?

But assuming your beliefs are testable, put on your scientist cap and actively search to prove them wrong. The point is that evidence matters. But we're after quality evidence, not unreliable "news" sites, memes, social media groups, or cherry-picked "experts," it doesn't help if we're listening to <u>Wishful Thinkers</u> stuck in the mud with their traditions of men! We are looking for irrefutable evidence backed by the Bible and science!

FACTS MATTERS TO GOD!

Christians should not fear using science to prove the Bible is true because science and scripture don't collide! No, they work together to establish the boundaries, providing the evidence and laying the foundation to build on!

If you haven't been taught the three Heaven and Earth Ages, you are not being taught the Bible correctly!

You will have missed a <u>HUGE</u> portion of scripture that hasn't been revealed to you! I have written a book, "NO FAIRY TALES IN HEAVEN," that covers this subject in great detail! It's also helpful to get into the habit of proportioning our beliefs to the evidence... meaning we can be more confident a belief is true the more evidence we have, and vice versa. Being overconfident can be based on illusion, and the lack of understanding of God's knowledge will prevent us from learning about our Father's will and mind. God's reality is complex. Embracing shades of gray will get you nowhere, especially avoiding what is written in blackand-white in the original manuscripts.

We need to be skeptical of what others teach us. Our belief system is a complex mix, but essential skills are required, and we must have the critical tools to grow in our knowledge of God. We must be open-<u>minded</u> if the evidence suggests we should be. Clinging to false beliefs or demanding impossible standards of proof before changing our minds may feel like a principled stand, but that <u>could be the definition of denial</u>!

However, just knowing that your inability to change your mind doesn't make you right. And there can be serious consequences to being wrong...false beliefs can cause you to lose what you're so desperately trying to hold onto: Salvation. One more thing: "Even if they are unfounded, do you want to believe in someone else's belief system or establish your facts using the original manuscripts?

I've asked countless Christians this question, and they always respond with a resounding chorus of, **"Of course**!" But as time passes, everybody is faced with questioning long-standing beliefs they are unsure of. Emotional attachment to beliefs can result in us engaging in feelings that often lie to us and prevent us from accepting God's reality.

Ensure your emotions are not getting in the way of God's reality!

According to most religious interpretations, the essential aspect of God's reality is His love, often described as all-encompassing and unconditional. It forms the foundation of His character and interactions with creation; essentially, the core of God's being is love and the desire to connect with humanity through it. The most important thing to know about God is that He's good, and to run to Him is life. He's not looking to rip you off. He's looking to set you free. God is real; it's been said, "The reality of God is to be found in our hearts, in the Spirit of Jesus Christ. In prayer, we open our hearts to his presence; we experience God as the source of our being and of all being.

According to the Bible, God says that loving God with all your heart, mind, and soul is the most important thing. Jesus said that this commandment is the first and greatest commandment. Jesus also said that the second most important commandment is to love others as much as you love yourself. Jesus said that all the Law of Moses and the Books of the Prophets are based on these two commandments. Some say that loving God is the essence of a person's relationship with God. Some say that the most essential thing in all of Scripture is to follow Jesus and love God with all your heart, mind, soul, and strength.

There is an essential distinction between the most important commandment in the Law and the most crucial thing in all the Bible! The Bible's most critical thing is to ensure we are getting it right! Right, meaning that we understand things the way

God intended. According to the Pew Research Center, approximately 1.1 billion people worldwide identify as non-believers, which includes those who are religiously unaffiliated, atheists, or agnostics, making up around 16% of the global population. The estimated number of people who don't believe in a God ranges from 500 million to 1.1 billion people. This group includes atheists, agnostics, and people who don't identify with any religion. A 2024 Pew survey found that 28% of Americans are unaffiliated. Estimates of the population with no religion range to almost a hundred million.

Islam is the fastest-growing Religion!

Isn't it ironic that Mohmmed came along 500 years after a bunch of Kenites murdered Jesus Christ? It almost appears as though the Arab people needed to create their savior. Some people trust in Gold and Silver. Some people trust in unicorn parts! I know that I do not want to be on the wrong side of the argument about who God is. God is whoever HE says HE is! In the Bible,

God describes himself as the creator of the universe, a loving and merciful God, and the giver of salvation. He also says that he is the only God, and that there is no one like him. God's descriptions of himself in **Exodus 3:13-15**: "*I Am Who I Am*", "*I Am has sent me to you*", and "*This is my name forever.* [Yh-Vh) pronounced {Ya-ha-Vh}."

Isaiah 45:5-6, "I am the Lord, and there is no other, apart from me there is no other. I will strengthen you though you have not acknowledged me. So that from the rising of the sun to the place of its setting, men may know there is none besides me. I am the Lord, and there is no other."

The God of the Bible is the only true God.

He is set apart from all other gods, especially unicorn parts. He is a jealous God who wants to protect his honor and wants his children to have an abundant life and not be deceived by false gods who bring <u>confusion</u>, <u>rebellion</u>, and <u>unbelief</u> into the world.
